Re: AAM Reply on Deregistration as National Motorsports Body of Malaysia

Recent news publications appearing in the print and digital space with regards to the deregistration of AAM have caused much commotion amongst the motorsport fraternity. There has been confusion and backlash among members of the association, clubs and organisers who have long been under AAM stewardship. Race license holders and race officials have been severely affected by this predicament.

The Sports Commissioner of Malaysia (PJS) has issued a statement that AAM is no longer recognised as the Motorsports Sanctioning Authority in Malaysia. There were inaccuracies in the statement made by PJS. It has also raised more questions than answers.

AAM is still the Motorsports Sanctioning Authority in Malaysia through the mandate given by the International Motorsports Authorities (FIA, FIM and CIK). It is the responsibility of AAM to perform its function in sanctioning, issuance of racing licenses, insurance and other matters relating to motorsports as set out in the guidelines set by the International Motorsports Authorities.

AAM shall continue to perform its roles without fear or favor and with upmost neutrality in protecting the interests of its members, affiliated clubs and the motorsports fraternity. In view of this, AAM is actively pursuing options to address the issue.
